Our Circo Book Truck has served Logan Park families since our launch on May 19th (National Circus Day). Ms. Altamirano is interested in this particular project centered around our youth, literacy, and art because she wants to take a creative, fresh and engaging approach. She aims to improve community literacy and art inspired by stories in both English and Spanish, while leveraging the spectacle of the motorcoach.

As strange as it may seem, Iris and her partner, Andres, purchased a whimsical 28" foot Circus themed Motor coach from Barb and Vern of Eyota, MN. Along with Oba the tiger, Iris and Andres ran and performed in a traveling circus for the better part of three decades. Her experiences sparked Iris' passion to bring joy to children through storytelling, art, and culture.
