As you've likely heard, the Central Avenue closure (between 14th and 18th Avenues) is just weeks away – May 19th. The Central Avenue Closure Committee, sponsored by the Northeast Community Development Corporation, has been working hard to ensure that everyone is informed about the progress of the construction project, and to make sure all community and business concerns are considered in the process. The CACC and NECDC will initiate a fundraising campaign to help local businesses impacted by the construction and closure. These businesses will receive assistance with marketing, legal advising, direct outreach and financial support.

The LPNA will host another community forum about the Central Avenue project this month. Representatives from Metro Transit, MnDOT, the City of Minneapolis, and Ward 1 councilperson Kevin Reich will provides updates on the project and field questions from local residents.
