Yard waste collection will end the week of November 16, 2015. You may place yard waste, prepared to collection guidelines, out each week on your garbage day. Minnesota State law prohibits disposing of yard waste with garbage and requires the use of compostable bags for collection of yard waste from your home. Residents may also use their own reusable container, approximately 33 gallons in size with sturdy handles.

A Small Area Plan – A Compass for the Future

Andrew Dresdner, our consultant for this project, said to consider the Small Area Plan as a way **to set a direction** for the next 5 to 20 years for the neighborhood.

At the 10/21 Steering Committee meeting, Andrew outlined 3 purposes of doing a Small Area Plan:

1. Planning increases confidence in the neighborhood

People will want to stay here, start businesses here and fix up houses and buildings.

2. Review Land Use, Transportation & Movement, Open Spaces

Is the current zoning appropriate? Should parking and traffic be mediated? Are their improvements to the park people would like to see?

3. Make an emotional connection to the neighborhood

What makes Logan Park neighborhood unique and worth celebrating?

Pollinator Town Hall Forum report

In late October at Van Cleve Park, a panel from the sciences, state government, and the community discussed with NE citizens of the plight of pollinating insects in our area.

Who are the pollinators? 200 types of bees in Minnesota, butterflies including Monarchs, the threatened Poweshiek Skipperling, Dakota skipper and Karner Blue, beetles, flies wasps, midges and the Ruby Throated Hummingbird.

Pollinator plants to name a few are milkweed, goldenrod, joe pye weed, black-eyed Susan, prairie blazing star and columbine.
