Help Plan the Future of Minneapolis Parks!

Thursday, September 17th 6:30pm Logan Park

The Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) is currently undergoing several large projects that will help shape our award-winning park system for the next 20 years – and beyond!

Closing the Gap: Investing in Our Neighborhood Parks looks at the impacts that deferred maintenance has had on many neighborhood parks. MPRB's Board of Commissioners will be in the community sharing information with Minneapolis residents and listening to their concerns and ideas about how to best restore our neighborhood parks.

RecQuest is the MPRB's in-depth look at its recreation centers – the physical spaces within the recreation centers and the programs, services and activities they provide. The project's goal is to see if the centers are meeting our community's current needs as well as projected needs 20 to 30 years into the future!

Master Plans - While RecQuest looks at the recreation centers, the Park Board also needs to look at the outdoor assets of a park: playgrounds, athletic fields, wading pools, sports courts and much more. This is done through a master plan, which uses community input to create both a long-term vision and specific elements for the MPRB's five geographical Minneapolis service area.

Meetings about all three efforts are taking place across Minneapolis. The meeting to talk about Logan Park's future will take place Thursday, September 17th at 6:30pm at Logan Park 690 13th Ave NE.
