Join the annual neighborhood clean-up. Everyone is encouraged to put waste items out for pick-up by 9 AM Saturday morning May 4th 2013. Volunteers who wish to join the effort need to be at the Logan Park Community Center on the 13th Ave NE side of the building by 8:45 AM to meet the City of

Minneapolis garbage trucks. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

Logan Park Neighborhood residents and businesses may legally dispose of, for no charge, the following types of items: garbage in bags, lumber and other building debris such as plaster, sheetrock, shingles, kitchen sinks, appliances, pipe, bed frames, mattresses, box springs, asphalt, brick, concrete, rock and tires.

Prohibited materials include all hazardous wastes. For example: florescent light bulbs, paint and solvents are excluded from pick-up. This is not a complete list of exclusions. If something is accidentally put out that does not fit the acceptable criteria, volunteers will leave it and take the rest of the items for disposal.

Anyone living in the area west of Central Ave NE and east Washington St NE and south of 19th Ave NE and north of Broadway St NE are eligible to participate.

Elections LPNA

Grant Awarded

LPNA was awarded Mississippi Water Management Organization, MWMO, planning grant for 10,000 dollars to assist Rivereast Development, RED, with a storm water management pilot project at their business complex. The planning grant will be used to assess the rain leader situation at 1828 Jefferson St NE building and provide a design to rectify the storm water problem. The aim of the grant is to radically change the way waste water is managed on the site by creating a water catchment system for irrigation. Native plants will be reintroduced at the site. Thus, the rain water will be kept out of the storm sewer and potable water will not be used for yard watering. Ironically, this building was built by the City of Minneapolis in 1924 and served as a water pumping station for Northeast Minneapolis. RED has a long history of championing prairie preservation. Bill Carlson's cinematography on the documentary "America's Lost Landscape: The Tallgrass Prairie" won national awards and was featured on PBS. Bill Carlson and Denise Gardner are co-owners of RED.
