Schafer Richardson Project

Schafer Richardson, Inc., a Minneapolis-based developer, is proposing a new multifamily project located along 14th Avenue NE, near Central Avenue. The site is currently used for vehicle and trailer storage, as well as two buildings containing a vehicle serving facility, file storage, and a small amount of office space. The proposed project is six-stories with approximately 175 apartment units that will be affordable at 60% of Area Median Income. Units will be a mix of studios, 1-bedroom, 2-bedroom, and 3-bedrooms. Site amenities will include a residential community room, fitness room, Tot-lot, outdoor patio space, and secured bicycle storage. The building will also feature an on-site management and leasing office. In recognition of the importance of the arts to community of Northeast Minneapolis, there will be public art gallery space of approximately 1,000 square feet within the building to provide opportunities for local artists to showcase artwork.

Additionally, Schafer Richardson is proposing a makerspace building on the site to provide work space for artists. The building will be industrial in look and comprise approximately 5,000 square feet. Schafer Richardson has been actively meeting with members of the Northeast Arts District to understand the functionality of the makerspace and how it can best be designed to meet the needs of artists. The site will also have approximately 142 parking stalls along with outdoor bicycle parking.

The project has been submitted to the City of Minneapolis for review by the Committee of the Whole. Schafer Richardson anticipates submitting for Land Use application by mid-July. Entitlements needed include a Variance for height from 4-stories to 6-stories, a Conditional Use Permit for a Planned Unit Development, and an alley relocation. The current proposal is subject to changes as the planning process develops.
