

Save recyclables and appliances and metal for regular recycling days. No hazardous wastes, please. Volunteers: you get to see a new side of the neighborhood, great gardens and patios behind some houses. Meet at the Logan parking at 8:00 a.m., dress for grunge, and wear gloves. Special graffiti clean-up supplies will be available April 30th and May 1st at Central & Lowry as part of WEED IT AND REAP and the BIG BRUSH OFF.

An exterior environment City Housing Inspection sweep will begin April 19th, tagging for: rubbish, overgrown vegetation in alleys and over sidewalks, missing address numbers, inoperable vehicles, etc. Property owners will have seven to ten days to correct the violations, or else city crews will come and do it with a charge assessed to the property taxes. So let's clean up, folks!
