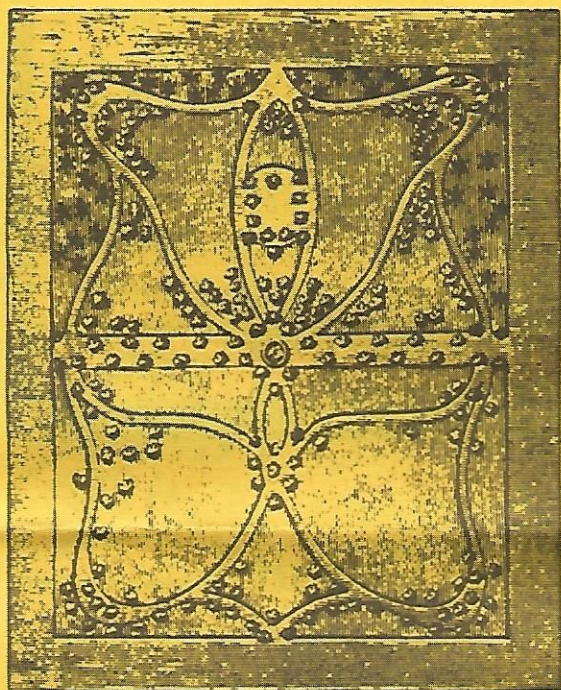

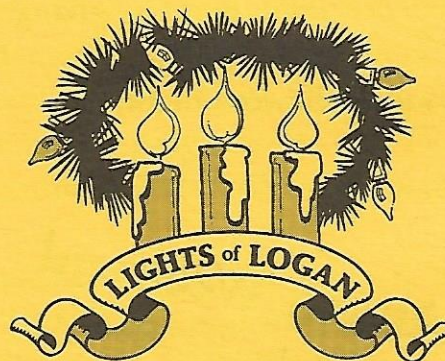

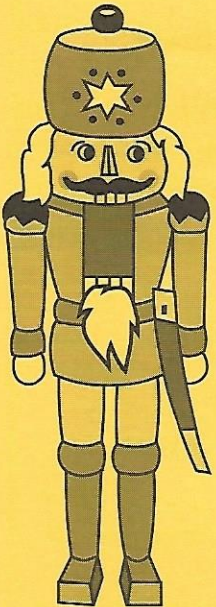


A great big thank you to all the folks at Logan Park Community Center, and at Elim Baptist Church for their help in giving the neighborhood kids a fun, safe Halloween night!

## NRP/Crime & Safety

\$1 million of NRP revenues are now available for *community-oriented public safety activities*, above the regular city budget for neighborhoods with an appropriate program in their Phase II action plans. Logan Park has Crime & Safety plans, including Cops on Bikes, and lighting improvements. These could be funded sooner than other programs in our Phase II. Call Christine at 788-7863 for more information.

A northeast town meeting was held on NRP Crime & Safety priorities, and these are the top six points identified:

- Increase numbers and hours of CRT officers
- Utilize Cops on Bikes
- Increase police presence at peak times
- Develop specific strategies related to outreach with new immigrant populations for all neighborhoods
- Late night noise enforcement
- Increase the diversity of the police force and incorporate foreign language training.
