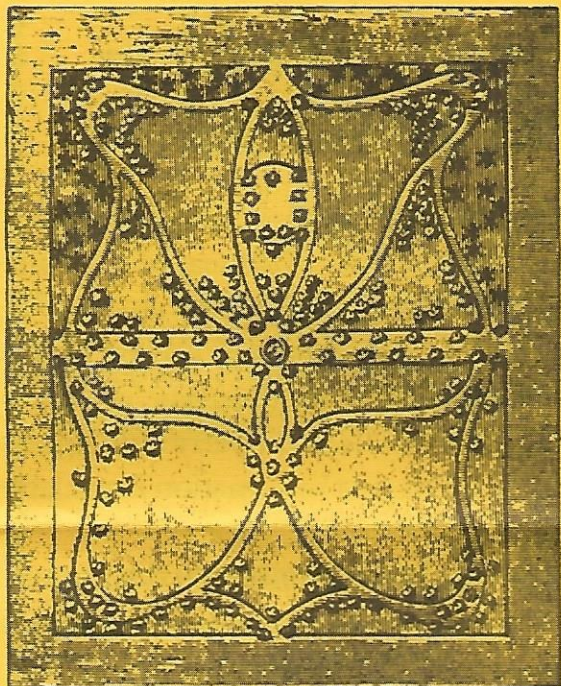

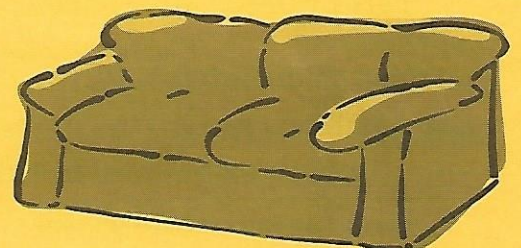
E-Reporting Makes it Easier to File a Police Report

Folks in Minneapolis can now file police reports on-line, using the Minneapolis Police Department's new on-line police report filing system. On-line police reports can be filed to document vandalism to property or motor vehicles, and lost or stolen property if no injuries occurred and no suspect information is available.

To file an on-line police report, visit their website at www.ci.minneapolis.mn.us/police/e-report. Reporters can call (612) 673-3163 to set up a demonstration of the new on-line police reporting system.
