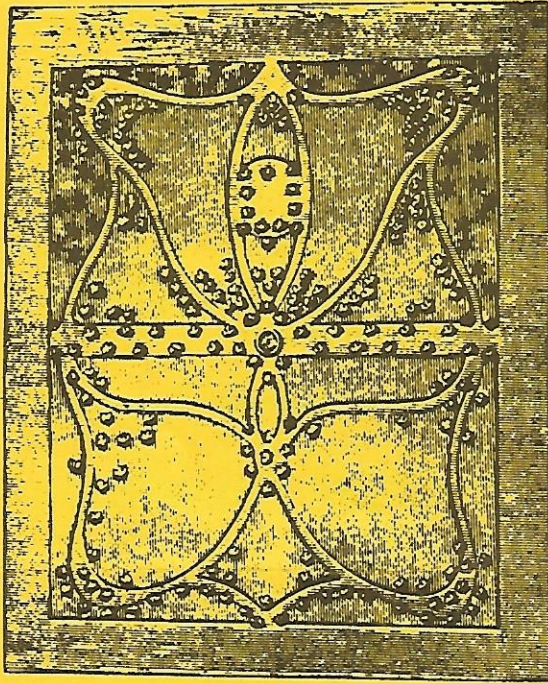

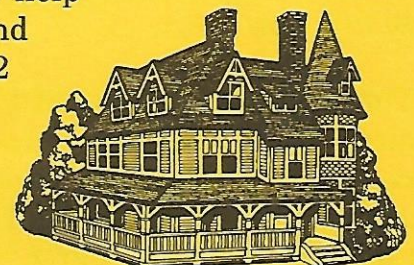

The snail-paced process has been completed. LPNA is now officially and legally a non-profit organization. That means contributions to the organization are now **tax deductible!**

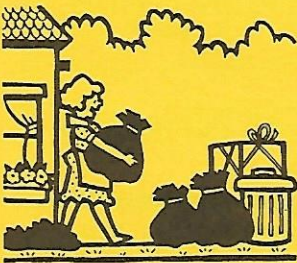
LOGAN PARK NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN SWEEP AND PANCAKE BREAKFAST

CLEAN SWEEP: 9:00 am - 1:00 pm

Logan Park Neighborhood Association is ready to make your spring cleaning easier. Empty out your attics and basements, clean up your yard, and pile the debris by your alley. Garbage trucks will be driving through the neighborhood, and all you have to do is throw in the trash.

- Label any items intended for the neighborhood garage sale held at the Logan Park Community Center on June 1, 1996. No clothing please. Tax deduction slips will be available.
- No paint, motor oil, household hazardous waste, automobile batteries, brush, yard waste, or appliances will be picked up. Up to two tires per address can be collected. Vouchers for items such as construction debris, metal scrap, lumber, auto parts, concrete/masonry, and shingles will be available.



- Volunteers will be with the trucks to hand out vouchers, pick up garage sale items, and if needed, to help you load the trash.
- Plan an alley or street clean up with your neighbors for that morning. It's *your* block, and think how nice it will look without all the soggy wrappers, broken glass, and sand that the snow leaves behind.



PANCAKE BREAKFAST: 8:00 am - 10:00 am

Get your trash out by the alley the night before, or early on Clean Sweep morning, then come down to Logan Park Community Center for breakfast. After we have all filled up on pancakes, let's go out, clean up our streets and alleys, and fill those garbage trucks!
