


PIANO LESSONS

STAGING YOUR FAMILY STORIES

This class for children of all ages and their families will be offered at Logan Park. There will be creative dramatics through non-threatening theatre games, mask-making, and simple set designing, resulting in a small performance. No prep, no memorization — just play. It will be taught by Darcy Engen, professor of drama at the University of Northern Iowa, and Mary Alterman, a northeast artist and teacher. JOB OPENINGS



Housing

Early this fall, the NRP Housing Programs will get underway. Start planning your projects now, as projects will need formal bids from contractors or well-written plans if you are doing the work yourself. There will be at least ten grants for exterior work, where residents must match the grant money. The maximum grant is \$2500. These will be selected by lottery, and if you were chosen in the previous "Fix and Paint" program, you are not eligible for this one.



Everyone, however, is eligible for the lowinterest loan program. Details should be available is August or September, and this is for interior or exterior work. Full information packets will be distributed to the neighborhood when the plans are finalized with the city and participating administrators.



LPNA encourages residents to attend an informational meeting on the Kondirator metal shredding machine that AIS wants to install on its Mississippi river site. MPCA air and water permits will be discussed. MPCA can put limits on the pollution emitted, but cannot rule on whether AIS can build the Kondirator on the river. That discussion is tangled in a lawsuit with the City of Minneapolis. This issue needs public involvement *more than ever*, so please try to attend this Wednesday, July 30, at 7:00 pm in Logan Park.
