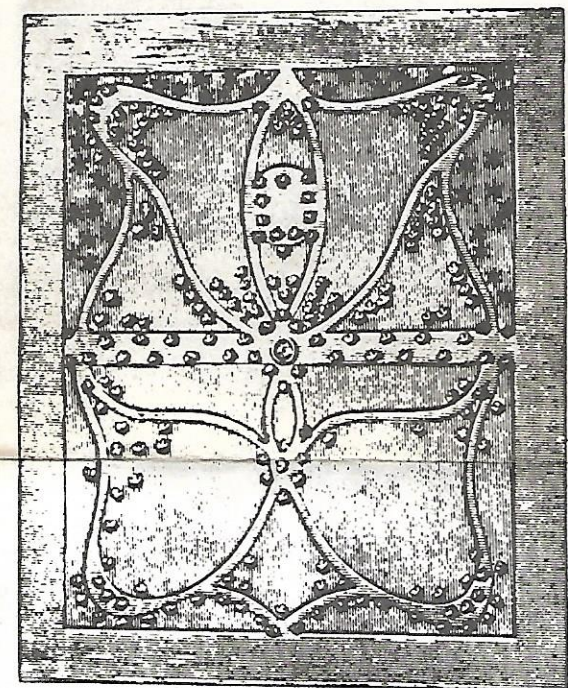
LOGAN PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION MISSION STATEMENT

For all our neighbors and new residents, LPNA stands for Logan Park Neighborhood Association. LPNA is you and your neighbors banding together to create an atmosphere where we can discuss problems and projects that pertain to us. LPNA addresses such livability problems as noisy neighbors, unkempt property, youth problems, theft and property damage, as well as fighting the enormous amount of pollutants in the Northeast area.

We are also cooperating with other neighborhoods on establishing a grocery store on 18th and Central and improving 13th Avenue as a gateway to the river. Because we are growing, we need short-term and long-term help on various committees, from doing typing and handing out fliers, to working a fundraiser event, to presenting an appeal to the City Council. 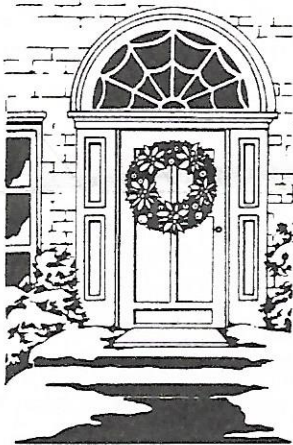

Thank you to Eagles Aerie No. 1247 FOE for their generosity in putting together Holiday Food Baskets for Logan Park residents in need.

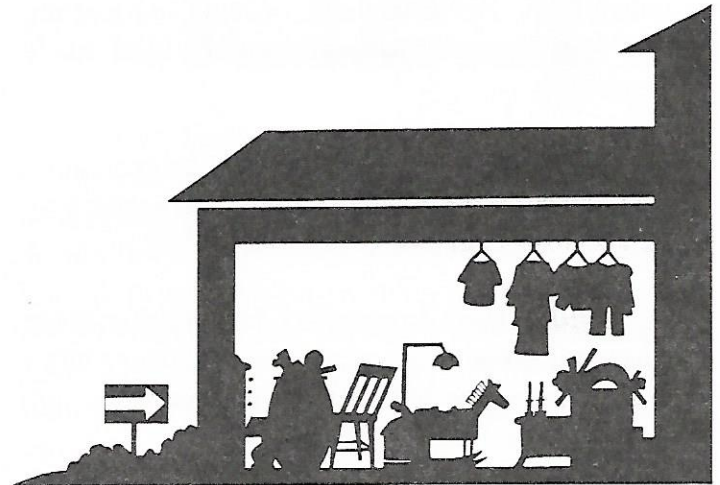
