



LPNA Fix & Paint Program Provides \$200,000 for Neighborhood Homeowners

Want to fix up your house? A new Fix & Paint program of the Logan Park Neighborhood Association may help. LPNA recently received a grant through Minneapolis' Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) that will make grants of up to \$5000 available to Logan Park property owners.

The funds are available for almost any improvement to the exterior of your home or property. This includes garages, landscaping, painting, roofs, porches, steps, sidewalks, driveways, siding, trim, gutters & downspouts, doors, windows (exterior), and repairs. Storage buildings, playground equipment, hot tubs and additions are **not** eligible.

Fix & Paint grand funds must be matched dollar for dollar. You can use your savings or get a loan to match the grant. If you need help with matching funds, there are several programs to assist people of all income



categories. Just call the Minneapolis C o m m u n i t y D e v e l o p m e n t Agency (MCDA) at 673-5286 and ask about their home improvement loans.

Both rental property owners and owner-occupants may apply, but owner occupants

will have first priority for the funds. The neighborhood has been divided into 3 equal sectors which will each receive 1/3 (\$67,100) of the funds.

The work must be done by building contractors licensed in Minneapolis, or by you as the homeowner. If

you do the work yourself, grant funds can only be used for the materials.


To kick off the program, there will be a Fix-It Fair on Saturday, February 19th, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the Northeast Armory, on Broadway and Polk Street Northeast. Come to the fair to get applications and information about the program. Building contractors, bankers, and public home improvement agencies will also be present to help you plan your project and obtain funds to match the Fix & Paint grants.

If you can't come to the fair, and you want an application packet, just send your name and address to:

You will be mailed an application form with complete instructions. If you still have questions, call Kim Vohs at 827-2297. Applications must be postmarked by March 25, 1994 to be valid, and contractor's bids must accompany your application.


Home Tour


