
Minnesota Black Community COVID-19 Hotline

The African American Leadership Forum (AALF) and Phyllis Wheatley Community Center (PWCC) are working together to help Minnesota's Black community navigate available resources and services needed to cope with the Health & Wellness, Economic Development, Education, and Family & Culture impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The MN Black Community COVID-19 Hotline is fully staffed and available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to provide callers with important info about where to find assistance for pandemic-related challenges and concerns, including but not limited to:

Parks for All Draft Plan

On Monday, Nov. 9, 2020, the Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) published a draft of Parks for All, the MPRB 2021 Comprehensive Plan. Parks for All is a new comprehensive plan that will set MPRB priorities and policy direction for the next decade. Minneapolis community members, park users, MPRB staff and partners are encouraged to review the plan and send feedback during a 70-day public comment period that ends Monday, Jan. 18, 2021.

The draft document will be the MPRB's agency policy direction based on shared values with community, agency staff and elected officials. It will provide guidance in developing policy, establishing or changing programs and services, setting the annual MPRB budget and creating park improvements over the next decade. Parks for All focuses on the park system as a whole, not specific recommendations for individual parks. The extensive engagement process was intended to develop a path toward a future that reflects the values, expectations and dreams of the communities served by the Minneapolis park system and MPRB commissioners and staff. Approximately 5,000 people have been involved in providing input on the draft document.

Notice of Funding Availability for affordable housing

The City of Minneapolis just released a notice of funding availability for affordable housing. The two financing opportunities – (1) Minneapolis Homes: Financing Program and (2) Missing Middle Rental Housing Pilot Program – will collectively have approximately \$5M of funding available to develop affordable ownership and rental opportunities on City-owned and privately owned sites throughout Minneapolis. Submissions for all options are due at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, January 29, 2021. Over 300 vacant City-owned parcels and approximately \$5 million of financing are available for development activities through three different pathways.

City's freelance worker protections ordinance takes effect Jan. 1

The City's new freelance worker protections ordinance takes effect Jan. 1, 2021. The ordinance will help prevent the exploitation of freelance workers, including many self-employed entrepreneurs who work as independent contractors. This ordinance requires businesses that hire certain freelancers for their work in Minneapolis to confirm their agreement in writing. It's a violation of the ordinance for a hiring party to refuse to pay the freelancer as stated in the contract, or to demand a freelancer accept less compensation after work has started as a condition of being paid on time. The MPRB plans to open 39 ice rinks at 18 parks across Minneapolis for ice skating, hockey or broomball. Please check minneapolisparks.org for opening dates.

Warming rooms will not open until at least Jan. 18, 2021. MPRB staff determined they could not be operated in compliance with the guidelines in the most recent Executive Order (20-103). Free loaner skates will not be available this year.

Parade Ice Garden and Northeast Ice Arena are scheduled to reopen Jan. 4, 2021, in accordance with the Executive Order 20-103. MPRB staff anticipates games and competitions restarting the week of Jan. 11 under the new rules and guidance.
